Student Dress Code Policy

The purpose of this policy is to establish the basic requirements for the appropriate dress code for our students.

The following minimum standards of dress will apply to all schools throughout District Council 16 and will be strictly enforced.

A student's dress and appearance should not be such that it causes disruption, is immodest, distracts from the educational process or creates a health or safety issue. All students have the responsibility to comply with this policy.

- 1. Full length denim type pants, sleeved shirts and closed to shoes must be worn at all times and must be appropriate for job site activities.
- 2. Underwear must be completely covered with outer clothing at all times.
- 3. Pants must be worn near the waist and long t-shirts must be tucked in.
- 4. Hooded garments shall not be worn inside the classroom.

In addition to the above, the following will apply to all shop type classes:

- 1. Long sleeve shirts must be worn.
- 2. Work boots (no tennis shoes).
- 3. No loose clothing or jewelry is permitted.
- 4. All appropriate personal protective equipment shall be worn at all times.

Students who violate the Student Dress Code Policy shall be required to modify their appearance. Any student who refuses to comply shall be removed from class and marked absent for the day. Any student who repeatedly fails to comply, will be removed from training indefinitely and referred to their JAC for appropriate disciplinary action. Reinstatement to school requires a Board of Trustees' action.
