#### PURPOSE

Carries out the day to day plumbing needs of the Convention Center Corporation.

- Required to perform journeyman level work.

- Provide routine daily checks and activities. Responsibilities included, but not limited to, all restroom fixtures, kitchen fixtures, dishwashers, grease traps, hood wash-down system, drinking fountains, hot water heaters, building sewer system, dewatering system, storm drains, air conditioning condensate drains, water usage/conservation, water softener, reverse osmosis, and perform a system check on the fire sprinkler system.
- May be required to lend support to other trades.
- Ability to answer guest questions regarding the facility.
- Maintains proper care of uniforms, equipment, and supplies.
- Must be able to work holidays and weekends

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

## **EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE**

High school diploma or general education degree (GED) plus successful completion of a craft apprenticeship program or on the job training program providing journeyman level experience; and three years related journeyman level experience and/or training; or equivalent combination of education and experience. NITC journey-level plumber certification is highly preferred.

## **LANGUAGE SKILLS**

Ability to read and comprehend instructions, short correspondence, and memos. Ability to write simple correspondence. Ability to effectively present information in one-on-one and small group situations to customers, clients, and other employees of the organization.

## **MATHEMATICAL SKILLS**

Ability to add, subtract, multiply, and divide into all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions, and decimals. Ability to compute rate, ratio, and percent and to draw and interpret bar graphs.

## **REASONING ABILITY**

Ability to apply common sense understanding to carry out detailed but uninvolved written or oral instructions. Ability to deal with problems involving a few concrete variables in standardized situations.

Ability to establish and maintain an effective working relationship with co-workers and the general public. Must be able to work day, evening, and graveyard shifts, as well as weekends and holidays.

## **PHYSICAL DEMANDS**

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to maneuver throughout the facility to perform job tasks and work assignments, and respond to both emergency and non-emergency situations. The employee is regularly required to be mobile to, from, and around the plumbing shop. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to handle or feel; reach; climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl; and talk or hear. The employee is occasionally required to be stationary. The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 25 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, peripheral vision, and depth perception.

## WORK ENVIRONMENT

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is occasionally exposed to outside weather conditions. The employee must be aware of and use proper personal protection equipment (PPE) necessary to safely complete the assigned task. The employee is regularly exposed to fumes or airborne particles. The noise level in the work environment is usually moderate.
